



WINTER UPHILL TRAVEL POLICY
Updated 6/30/15

- **WARNING!** In accordance with Massachusetts law, a skier assumes the risk of any injury or loss resulting from any of the inherent dangers and risks of skiing and may not recover from any ski area operator for any injury resulting from any of the inherent dangers and risks of skiing including variations in terrain, surface or subsurface snow, ice conditions or bare spots; collision with natural objects, man-made objects or other skiers; and the failure of skiers to ski within their own abilities.
- Ski Patrol at Jiminy Peak is only available when the ski area is open during normal operating hours.
- All skis or snowboards must be equipped with a brake or leash.
- All uphill skiers must cease uphill travel before the posted operating time for that day.
- Jiminy Peak reserves the right to close uphill trails or terminate uphill travel without notice.
- All skiers/ boarders must have a valid pass or ticket once Jiminy Peak is open and operating.
- Stay clear of all snowmaking and snow grooming operations. Winch cable grooming may be in operation both day and night.
- Preferred method of uphill travel is John Hancock.

During early and late season when Jiminy Peak is not operating, all uphill skier traffic is prohibited.
