



## RESORT POLICIES

- **No Excessive Noise.** Quiet hours must be respected from 10:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m.
- **Smoking.** Smoking (including vaping) of any kind (tobacco or cannabis) is prohibited on the Resort (including on a chairlift or in a lift line) except in designated outside smoking areas (tobacco and non-cannabis only) are only permitted.
- **Chairlift Safety.** The use of or being under the influence of alcohol or drugs while on a chairlift is prohibited. You must know how and be able to load, ride, and unload lifts safely. You must lower the armbar when riding the chairlift and only lift it when signage or Resort staff instructs you.
- **Unregistered Motor Vehicles.** Driving unregistered, non-resort vehicles on the Resort campus is prohibited. They must be stored inside their transport vehicle while at the Resort.
- **Parking.** Do not park on the grass. Vehicles must comply with all traffic signs and speed limits. Speeding is prohibited. Pedestrians always have the right of way. Do not park vehicles in a manner that impedes access to fire lanes, hydrants, or walkways.
- **Pets.** Subject to the requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act and Fair Housing Act, pets are not allowed inside any Resort commercial area. Pets must be leashed at all times. Pets are not allowed on chair lifts. Pets are not permitted in any area where skiing, snowboarding, or mountain biking is taking place during operating hours. Pet owners are responsible for disposing of their pet's waste.
- **Prohibited Areas.** The Resort's operational areas are restricted to staff only, and guests are not permitted access to these areas unless expressly escorted by Resort staff. These areas include staff offices, back-of-house areas, maintenance zones, heavy machinery areas, and other spaces not directly involved in the guest experience.
- **Policy Violations.** Guests violating Massachusetts law or Resort rules are subject to having their lift tickets or season passes revoked without refund, removal from the Resort, filing of a trespass notice, or enforcement by the Massachusetts State Police.
- **Personal Property.** The Resort is not responsible for loss or damage to guests' personal belongings, including ski equipment and clothing.
